Language Requirement -- Students are required to have some experience in the acquisition of a second language. This may be satisfied through informal learning, immersion, or two or more years of formal coursework in a second language. Any recognized natural language will be acceptable to fulfill this requirement (including ASL or other sign languages). Artificial languages, e.g. computer languages, will not satisfy this requirement. For students selecting the multilingualism concentration, proficiency must be demonstrated in English and in at least one other language.

This form should be submitted as soon as possible to insure that your language requirement has been met prior to advancement which must take place by the end of the fourth year in the program. The information will be reviewed by the JDP-LCD Executive Committee and the student will be notified as to whether or not the language requirement has been satisfactorily completed.
